Introduction of Story Telling Youth Engagement Model in Pakistan

Bargad with the support of Meta Platforms, Inc (Facebook) introduced story telling model for youth engagement and peace-building in Pakistan



Lobbying and Implementation of 2% Minority Quota

Bargad made strides in generating the attention of academia towards inclusion of gender minorities (transgender), religious minorities, PWDs, and Women at higher education through 2% minority quota during its 2nd Vice Chancellors' Conference with 11 VCs and representatives of 13 universities, PHEC. Sixty students secured their admissions under the quota.



Mapping and Assessment of Alternative Care Facilities in Punjab

The study provided causal context of the communities in the backdrop of alternate care options and regulatory framework for alternative care for children in Punjab. The study contributed into the provincial registry and care reforms.







Economic Empowerment of Women

Bargad provided technical assistance to around 1500 women from vulnerable group to be linked with financial support mechanism i.e. MFIs, government schemes etc.



Bargad Volunteers Featured in BBC

BBC Radio featured talks of two (02) Bargad's volunteers on their case studies of pro-peace messaging among youth in Pakistan.



Contribution in Global Toolkit on Hate Speech

Bargad contributed in a global toolkit for civil society and activists by Minority Rights Group International on "The Hate Speech Crises: Ways to start fixing it."

Youth-Led Projects

The trainee youth of the Bargad under different projects have led, managed, designed and implemented their own 105 short projects, called the Social Action Projects (SAPs) engaging their peers and communities.



1- Youth Story Tellers

Meta project trained 17 young storytellers, equipping them with storytelling techniques, leadership skills, and social media proficiency. They used these skills to create and execute social action projects within their universities and communities. The goal was to shape public narratives around social cohesion, tolerance, and peace. The stories were shared on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and YouTube, and were also featured at a collaborative CERITA festival with the country partner.

2- Young Omang Pakistan

Bargad has been part of the network since 2018 as an advocacy and lobbying expert. Young Omang is focused on Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) in Pakistan. In 2022, the network secured a grant from Amplify Change and will end in 2025. As a member of the network, Bargad will engage in lobbying and advocacy efforts to raise the minimum age of marriage for girls from 16 to 18 in Punjab. Bargad will also train Punjab-based CBOs on advocacy and lobbying tools, involving them in this important agenda.

3- Mapping and Assessment of Alternative Care Facilities in Punjab

The project was implemented with the support of UNICEF in Punjab Province from July 2021 to July 2022. The report has not yet been published by UNICEF.



4- Communities of Hope: Intra and Inter-faith Harmony for Sustainable Peace

With the support of NCA, the project addressed the issues of religiously motivated violent extremism and hate speech through promotion of social cohesion, intra/interfaith dialogue, and cooperation initiatives in 8 union councils of Lahore and Gujranwala. The project promoted 2% minority quota and resolved 15 conflicts in communities

5- Coalition for Religious Equality and Inclusive Development

As part of the Pakistan initiative, named, Challenging and Understanding Religious Exclusion (Pakistan CURE – P)." Bargad built capacity, engaged, mobilized and institutionalized strengthening of youth while monitoring, tracking and analyzing hate-speech on regular basis in Pakistan.

6- Addressing COVID-19-related Inequalities

The project mobilized key local leaders and communities in collaboration with relevant HR&MA Department to promote social and cultural integration necessary to address inequalities exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, particularly the negative impacts experienced by the most vulnerable populations, of the communities.

7- My Dream, My Business

The project started in 2022 and will end in 2025. It will train 2000 women from 15 Lahore and Gujranwala union councils and provide tool kits to 100-150 women to start/expand their start-ups/microbusiness. The need assessment has been done which will contributed in developing manuals on business management and employbility.

8- Joint Social Action for Inclusive Society

Bargad adopted an integrated approach by engaging all key stakeholders to improve protection and participation of vulnerable groups as well as strengthening Community Peace Groups (CPGs) in eight/8 Union Councils (UCs) of Lahore. The project resolved 8 conflicts in communities.

9- Socio-Economic Recovery of Afghan Refugee Women-Girls in Punjab & Balochistan


The project started in 2022 and will conclude in 2024. The focus of the project is social development and economic recovery of Afghan refugee women and girls in Balochistan and Punjab. The need assessment has been completed which provided the baseline for project result framework.




